Darien Civic Engagement Project Fall 2020 Application Information and Materials

The Eagleton Institute of Politics, under the auspices of the *Darien Fund for the US Constitution*, *Citizenship, and Civic Engagement*, invite students to join the *Darien Civic Engagement Project (DCEP)*. A for-credit political learning opportunity for Rutgers students interested in mobilizing and engaging their fellow students. The DCEP offers students an exciting opportunity to put their interest in politics and what they learn in the classroom into action on the Rutgers campus and in local communities.

Through their work for the project, enrolled students will register for **790:250: Special Topics in Political Science: Darien Civic Engagement Project** and will receive 1.5 credits for their work in

DCEP. Working together with Dr. Elizabeth Matto of the Eagleton Institute of Politics and the RU

Voting Program Coordinator- an initiative designed to register, educate, and mobilize Rutgers students to be politically active. In a selection of discussions led by Professor Matto of the students also will explore the ideals of fostering citizenship in the populace.

DCEP students will:

- Register for 790:250: Special Topics in Political Science: Teaching Citizenship
- Meet together every Thursday from 10:55AM to 12:15PM at Eagleton Institute of Politics;
- Help organize and participate in voter registration drives on campus; and,
- Participate in an end-of-the-semester luncheon presentation at the Eagleton Institute of Politics, reviewing the work they completed throughout the semester

Eligibility Requirements

- Must be enrolled in an Undergraduate or Graduate program at Rutgers-New Brunswick
- Must have a minimum GPA of 3.0
- Must be able to meet for class every Thursday from 10:55AM to 12:15PM

Duties and Responsibilities of DCEP members:

- Attend weekly meetings of the DCEP administered by Dr. Elizabeth Matto. Weekly meetings
 will take place on Thursdays from 10:55AM-12:15PM in the Library of the Eagleton Institute of
 Politics on Douglass Campus.
- Participate in at least 4 hours of RU Voting mobilization efforts on campus
- Participate in the culminating end-of-the-semester luncheon at Eagleton Institute of Politics
- DCEP students may be photographed or videotaped over the course of the project.
